



Dutch Sex facts 12-25 year

14,4 year; 50% has been kissing, boys somewhat earlier than girls.

17,1 year 50% has had sexual intercourse. The same % as in 2005. The Dutch are comparing to other European countries late.

For most youth the first time is unexpected. For 38% of the boys and 31% of the girls completely unexpected.

14% of the girls and 5% of the boys say they have been persuaded the first time.

Most youth have sex with a steady partner. 32% of boys have stands and 19% of girls.

2,7% of boys and 1,5% of girls tell they are gay.

90% got there information about sex, anticonception and STD at school.

When boys want to know something about sex they looking at the internet. Girls talk to there friends.

73% of the boys watched porn, 21% of the girls. 33% of the boys and 15% of the girls called it instructive.

For boys religion was hardly important for sexual experience. Christian and Islamic girls have less sexual experience than girls who are non-religious.

75% uses a condom at the first time. Religious girls uses condom less often at the first time.

9 from 1.000 boys and 13 from 1.000 girls have been diagnosed with STD the last year.

4 from 5 boys and girls uses anti-conception all the time.


11 from 1.000 girls had an unwanted pregnancy last year. 6 of the 11 had an abortion.





Purpose intervention


- "This intervention aims to be a preventive working tool, which can offer a framework, and a guide to anyone that works with children and young people. The objective is to make sexuality, desires and boundaries, criteria, and gradations of unacceptable sexual behaviour a subject of discussion. In this way this method aims to make a contribution to preventing unacceptable sexual behaviour amongst and towards children and young people" (Fragsystem, pg 13, Sensoa en Garant).
- Criteria; for all ages
- Program; 0-18 age
- Boys/girls/different sexual orientation
- Western society
- Also for people with physical or mental disabilities


Criteria for acceptable sexual behavior


- Mutual consent
- Voluntarity
- Equality
- Age-appropriate or developmental appropriate
- Appropriate within the context or appropriate for the situation
- Self-respect; not physical, psychological, social harmful for her/himself.
- Pedagogical answer to sexual behavior; acceptable- and unacceptable behavior
- To give criteria, ethical values
- As a start for conversation and ways to react








